<sup>5</sup> Includes actions involving federal tax burdens in which the U.S. government was either a plaintiff or a defendant, but does not include appeals from the Tax Court. Appeals from the Tax Court are considered appeals from an administrative agency.

<sup>6</sup> Includes actions filed in district courts that involve petitions for adjustment of status, visa applications, and other such matters. It does not include cases involving deportation or removal proceedings.
